

## **City Council Capsules for April 23, 2007**

**April 24, 2007**

At their April 23 meeting, the Port St. Lucie City Council: Listened to residents from the neighborhood of the Westport Wastewater Treatment Plant express concerns about expansion of the plant. The Council agreed to consider paying for a study to analyze the costs of an alternative plan, and will discuss the issue again in May.

Listened to a presentation from the city's utility and legal departments explaining why the city has strong historical, legal and technical reasons for providing water and sewer service to properties west of Rangeline Road.

Rezoned more than five acres on the north side of Gatlin Boulevard, between Bougainville Avenue and Savona Boulevard, to allow for construction of a bank and other commercial businesses.

Authorized the Engineering Department to begin sidewalk construction along as many as 10 high-priority roadways using money from a St. Lucie County grant. The first sidewalk to be built if the city receives the County's portion of the funds will be on Morningside Boulevard, from Port St. Lucie Boulevard to Lyngate Drive. Some of the other locations high on the list include parts of Tulip, California and Morningside boulevards.

Allocated \$288,000 in Federal Community Development Block Grant money to improve drainage on Darwin Boulevard.
