Mayor's State-of-the-City address scheduled for Oct. 12

PORT ST. LUCIE – Sept. 21, 2007 – Mayor Patricia P. Christensen will give her first State-of-the-City address on Friday, Oct. 12 at City Hall at 11 a.m.

Elected last November after serving several years as Vice Mayor and Councilwoman from District 1, Mayor Christensen's term has been highlighted by the start of more than \$250 million of major improvements and additions to the city including:

- Most segments of the Crosstown Parkway.
- The Civic Center and surrounding downtown.
- The Torrey Pines Institute for Molecular Studies.
- An interchange at I-95 and Becker Road.
- An agreement for a major retail outlet center at Gatlin Blvd. and I-95.
- An agreement for a major regional mall at Becker Road and I-95.

Another initiative of the Mayor has been to improve communication with residents by establishing a monthly "Coffee with the Mayor" meeting with the public, a monthly television show outlining her ideas on important topics, and a monthly e-newsletter letting residents know about projects she has been working on.

The public is welcome to attend the State-of-the City address, and it will be broadcast live on the city's government-access cable television channel, PSL-TV20. It also can be viewed live over the Internet from the city's Web site at www.cityofpsl.com.
