

'East Cashmere' NICE community meeting and survey

- What:** Community meeting for the neighborhood temporarily called 'East Cashmere' and opportunity to participate in online naming survey
- When:** The meeting will be Monday, Aug. 21, 2017, 7 p.m. to 8 p.m.; The online survey will be live until Friday, Aug. 18, 2017
- Where:** The meeting will be at Port St. Lucie City Hall, 121 S.W. Port St. Lucie Boulevard, City Council chambers
- Why:** As part of the City's Neighborhood Improvement and Community Engagement (NICE) program, residents are invited to submit name suggestions for the community that is tentatively called East Cashmere. The community boundaries are: north of the C-24 Canal, south of Crosstown Parkway, east of Cashmere Boulevard and Del Rio Boulevard and west of the Florida Turnpike. (See map below.) Name suggestions can be submitted through the survey until Aug 18 at <https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/EastCashmere>.

At the community meeting, residents will review the neighborhood names and work with City staff and its consultant to narrow the list down to five names.
