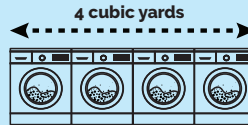




KEEPING YOUR YARD STORM-READY ALL YEAR

YEAR-ROUND MAINTENANCE:

- Trim trees and shrubbery regularly to decrease the chance of uprooting.
- Schedule significant yard cuttings between December and April.
- Being proactive means a lower risk of storm-related damage.



- Yard waste is limited to one 4-cubic-yard pile per week.

WHEN A STORM IS COMING:

- Do not trim vegetation of any kind.
- Do not begin construction projects.
- Monitor the City's website for updates or delays in service.
- Avoid placing piles of debris curbside; collection services can be suspended anytime.
- Avoid projects that will produce bulk piles.
- Service continues as usual until an emergency is declared.

AFTER THE STORM, HELP RECOVERY EFFORTS BY:

- Checking the City's website for updates on collection.
- Putting out debris (except garbage) in loose piles; bagged debris will not be collected.
- Being patient as we restore services.

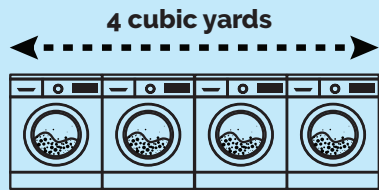

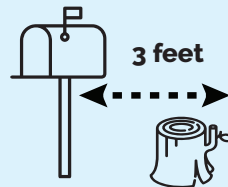


Mixed piles will be serviced last.

Tips to avoid a disruption in collection services:



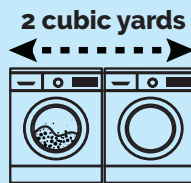
Yard waste is limited to one 4-cubic-yard pile per week.



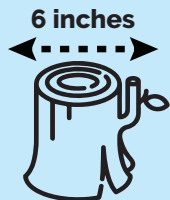
Keep debris clear of power lines, mailboxes and other obstructions.



Neatly stack tree branches and palm fronds in a pile.



Bulk waste is limited to 2 cubic yards per month, which is about the size of two front-load washers.



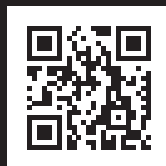
Follow the yard waste 4/6/50 rule (i.e. each piece cannot exceed 4 feet in length, 6 inches in diameter and 50 pounds).



Make sure to mark your garbage disposal day on your calendar. Scan the QR Code below.
